The Towers is delighted to offer:


- Healthy & Fit Exercise, tai chi, arts & crafts, bingo and trivia
- Guest speakers, including local Rabbis and other community members
- Presentations on important health-related topics led by both in-house staff and outside organizations
- Musical performances
- A wide variety of films shown multiple times per week
- In-house television services which provide additional programming for residents in their apartments. This includes religious services, exercise videos, documentaries and movies
- Horticulture: Residents plant vegetables, herbs and flowers in our courtyard
- Knitting and crochet groups: In the past year these groups made over 500 blankets for various local charitable organizations
- Live weekly Shabbat services with Spiritual Leader Ruthie Greenblatt. The Towers is proud to have been the only facility that continued these services as far back as August of 2020 and included all of the High Holidays
- Volunteers from the community, including Yale, connecting with residents via phone and letter writing. This began in April 2020 and continues today

Volunteering is critical to the success of our programs. Our activities are designed to enrich our residents' lives. There is something for everyone here at The Towers. A full calendar relies on "people power" to help facilitate our programs.
