Exterior Dining and Entrance Site Work

Lots of progress in these areas; the concrete footings were poured for our foundation (these support the concrete foundation floor).

This is really nice progress and puts us on track to pour the actual foundation within the next week or two.

As you can see in the picture, the car port is almost ready to be fully demolished. Once the pillars are

removed, we can pour new concrete and get the Tower One front entrance back open again. We're getting close and we appreciate everyone's patience. You've all been amazing thus far!
